Houston, TX

March 10th – 17th & March 17th – 24th, 2018

What is Eight Days of Hope XIV and XV all about?

Hurricane Harvey struck Texas in August of 2017. It will go down as one of the worse disasters ever seen by mankind. Over 350,000 homes in the state were affected by over 50 inches of rain and suffered over \$160 Billion dollars of damage. Over 80% of the families that received damage did not have flood insurance because they did not live in a flood zone which left them with little resources with which to rebuild. This is where we come in! Eight Days of Hope is serving Houston through the 4B Disaster Response Network. Our goal is to use the gifts that God has given us to bless others and share the love of Jesus!

What is the cost to attend Eight Days of Hope XIV and/or XV?

It is free! We provide the food and the lodging. You just have to show up with a willing heart to serve. We rely on churches, businesses, individuals and our volunteers for donations. A typical budget for an Eight Days of Hope event can be anywhere between \$600,000 and \$700,000. The budget for these two events is \$2.1 million dollars. What are the sleeping arrangements?

We will provide sleeping accommodations. Our headquarters and lodging will be based out of several churches. Similar to our previous trips, we will segregate by gender. You will have the space to set up your own air mattresses, cots or foam pads that you bring from home. (Please keep the size of the air mattresses to queen size or less.) You may also bring a tent and camp outside if you prefer. There will be gender segregated showers and restrooms available. If you are coming as a family and desire to be housed together, we suggest you bring a tent, RV or pursue hotel accommodations. We will not be able to offer free RV spots as we have in the past but will work with some local campsites to see if we can offer discounted sites. We will have those details by January 28th. Please check back.

If we want to book a hotel does Eight Days of Hope recommend any hotels in the area?

The location of our headquarters is still being determined. We will be serving in the Southeastern part of Houston. We will offer some suggestions for local hotels with discounted rates by January 28th. Please check back.

Do I have to bring my own food?

No. We will provide food for all of our volunteers. **We are looking for churches and businesses willing to underwrite this cost.** With a donation of \$3,000, a church or a business can supply the food necessary for one meal. Please email us at info@eightdaysofhope.com for more information. You can also elect to sponsor food for one entire day. Please consider doing either of these as the food costs for 4,000 - 5,000 volunteers will exceed \$150,000!

What kind of work will we be doing?

The primary work will be the rebuilding of damaged homes due to flooding. This includes electrical wiring, insulation, flooring, drywall, carpentry and painting. There are some roofs that need to be repaired before we start the interior. We are also in need of people who have mechanical and plumbing skills. We plan on rebuilding roughly 200 kitchens. Beyond home restoration there are many support jobs which include data entry, transportation, laundry, cleaning, and lunch delivery service. There is definitely something for everyone's skill set!

Should we bring tools?

Yes! Please bring any tools that you can, especially those that you would anticipate using. Air compressors, ladders, drills, drywall tools, paintbrushes, etc. are all needed. Eight Days of Hope has outfitted multiple tool trailers and will be bringing them to Houston to supplement any tools you may not own or bring.

Can we bring our youth group or our children?

Yes, Eight Days of Hope is very family friendly! Every youth volunteer (under the age of 18) that comes with an adult that is not their parent **MUST** bring a notarized Parental Consent form signed by one of his/her parents. We are asking for one adult chaperon for every four youth. Please remember that there will be unique sleeping arrangements separated by gender.

Families bringing their children will work side by side at the jobsites. If families wish to sleep together, there are local hotels, campgrounds and RV sites available. The local RV sites offering discounted rates will be available by January 28th.

Do we have to stay for all Eight Days?

No. For this event we are asking each volunteer to come for at least three full days. Please honor this request.

Is transportation provided from the area airport?

Yes. We will provide transportation from the William P. Hobby airport. The code for this airport when booking is HOU. Please email waynev@eightdaysofhope.com if you need transportation to and from Hobby. We will provide shuttle service starting Friday, March 9th, through Saturday, March 24th. Because the check-in desk for lodging closes at 8:00 pm, please note that if you arrive at Hobby after this time you will need to book a hotel for the night, and we will shuttle you to headquarters the following morning. *We are sorry, but we will NOT be providing any transportation from the George Bush Intercontinental airport.*

Can we bring our pets?

No. We are sorry, but bringing pets is not allowed for health and safety reasons. Please respect this rule. It will be strictly enforced. Our host facilities have strict rules in regards to pets.

If we are coming with a group or as a family can we fill out one volunteer form?

No, each volunteer needs to fill out a volunteer form at eightdaysofhope.com and include an email address. In the comments section of the volunteer form please make note that you are coming with a group and include the name of the group, so we can try to lodge you at one site. All of the members of this group can use one email address for communication purposes. Every member of a family needs to register separately unless they are under the age of 18. **A parent that registers, can register his/her children under the age of 18 on their volunteer form.** If you use one email address to register multiple volunteers, you will get a single confirmation to that email address.

What will be a typical day at Eight Days of Hope XIV - XV?

Breakfast will start around 5:45 and conclude around 7:00. We will spend 30 minutes together with a special time of worship and devotion before we head out to the work sites. Lunch will be delivered to the job sites. Supper will begin at 5:30 and conclude at 7:00. We invite the homeowners to dinner, and they get to share their stories. It is a very special time! An optional devotion and worship time will follow.

Will there be any medical support at Eight Days of Hope XIV - XV?

Yes. We will have at least one Registered Nurse onsite. If you are a medical professional and would like to be added to our list of medical resources, please make a note in the Comments section of your registration form. We will need additional support in this area.

Can I bring my RV?

Yes! We will share the information of a local RV site that we will recommend with a discounted rate by January 28th. Please check back here after that date. There are no free spots available.

If we volunteer for the first day, March 10th, when should we arrive?

The volunteer check-in area will open at 3:00 pm on March 9th. On Tuesday, March 6th, you will receive detailed instructions with the information on where you are to go to check-in and what to bring. The first meal we will provide will be dinner March 9th. Remember that we ask that you serve for a minimum of three days. Please honor that request.

What times can we arrive to “check in” to Eight Days of Hope?

On Friday, March 9th, the check-in area will be open at 3:00 pm. On all other days, the check-in area will be open from 6:30am to 8:00pm. Please plan to arrive between these times. If you arrive after 8:00pm, you will need to find a hotel for the night and check-in the next morning.

Is there a cut-off date to volunteer for Eight Days of Hope XIV - XV?

Yes. The last day one can volunteer for Eight Days of Hope will be Sunday, March 4th.

Are there any tools available for volunteers to promote Eight Days of Hope attendance or to help raise the financial support needed?

Yes! We have prepared a letter that you can use to present to your Missions Board or Church Leadership to help raise awareness or ask for financial support. We also have a letter that one can use to ask businesses or individuals to help offset the dollars needed by Eight Days of Hope. You may find these forms on our event page.
